

This memo is written in follow up to our meeting held at Thompson Community Center (TCC) on Friday, November 14, 2008. Present at the meeting with us was Mark Skrzynski. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss your continued contact with During this meeting you were
directed to and you agreed to stay away from and to not communicate with her in any
way in the workplace. You were specifically instructed to contact Pat Lowery or Mark Skrzynski in lieu of of

We also met on October 20, 2008 to discuss the inappropriate use of email, and your relationship with During this meeting, you were advised to avoid interacting with
possible. You were also cautioned about inappropriate use of district email. At this time, you indicated you would avoid and you would adhere to the district's policy.

It has come to my attention that on October 28, 2008 you sent an email to the entire Thompson staff regarding Senator Barack Obama and the presidential election. Again, this is a clear violation of district policy, which clearly states that *"any use of the network for product advertisement or political lobbying is prohibited."*

It has also come to my attention that on Tuesday, November 25, 2008 you left a handwritten letter in mailbox, as well as sent her two (2) email messages via the district email. This is in direct violation of the directive not to contact her. This behavior constitutes insubordination. Additionally, the two (2) email messages you sent are harassing in nature which also violates the policy which states, that *"hate mail, harassment, discriminatory remarks, and other antisocial behaviors are prohibited on the network."*

As you have continued to violate the district's Acceptable Use Policy your email privileges are suspended effective immediately.

Additionally, as you were insubordinate for failing to adhere to the directive to not contact you are suspended for three (3) days without pay. Your unpaid suspension will take place on Tuesday, December 2nd, Wednesday, December 3rd and Thursday, December 4th.

Please be advised that this type of behavior is unacceptable and will not be tolerated. Future occurrences of this nature will result in additional disciplinary action, up to and including termination.
